<u>Math</u>

There will be math homework usually 4 nights a week. Please review these assignments prior to turning in. Practice facts daily.

Spelling

Study daily for spelling tests. Spelling lists are handed out on Fridays, and the test will be given on Fridays. Lists are also posted on my Teacher Connection page.

Reading

Students should be reading daily to improve fluency, comprehension, build vocabulary, and meet AR goals. A tracking sheet is located in the Monday folders.

Assigned as needed; Studying for tests is a hw assignment.

Grading and Homework Policy

<u>Please note</u> that homework is assigned to help your child master the skills they have been taught at school.

- All homework is due the next day, unless specifically told otherwise. Items received 1 day late will be awarded a maximum of 60%, and a zero thereafter.
- Should your child be absent, all make up work is due upon return within the number of days missed plus one.
- It is your child's responsibility to make sure that make-up work is turned in within the three day time frame.
- Any assignment that has a previously determined due date, that due date must be observed unless arrangements have been made with the assigning teacher. Any variation of this must be approved by administration.
- Students will get a make-up folder if request is made in the morning for work to be sent home.
- Homework is 10% of the student's grade and needs to be done consistently!
- Students have opportunities to work on homework during the day!

Binders/Behavior & AR Logs

- Binders/Agendas will be brought home nightly.
- The agenda needs to be signed each night, even Fridays. This is our means of communication.
- On MONDAY your child's behavior log, AR goal progress sheet, and graded work will come home.
 Please review their work and sign & return both sheets and any graded work that has a stamp to be signed.
- Please remove the KEEP AT HOME work. Review and discuss comments written on your child's paper.
