


Did I do my job as an editor?

What we expect from your third grader...


Third grade students are expected to respond accurately to a text-based question with specific evidence, and that demonstrates their understanding of writing application skills. Over the school year, we build our expectations from simple tasks to full essay responses.

- An essential skill that provides the foundation for reading and writing is identifying the main idea within a portion of an article or the entire piece.
- This textual structure must be practiced in order for students to do higher order/critical reading and writing that the new standards expect.

Main Idea = Topic + Point

Key details/evidence-helps the reader/writer to find support (or prove) the point

Are you ready?

• The beaver's tail is broad and flat. When the beaver swims, its tail helps it to steer or go fast. Beaver sometimes slap the water with its tail- whack! This sound means danger. Model Paragraph

 A beaver's tail has many uses. When in the water, the beaver (creature) uses his tail like a rudder to steer and go fast. When on land, a beaver (mammal/critter) uses its tail to balance and walk. In fact, beavers (log chewers) tail is even used like a ladder when building its home.
