Dear First Grade Parents and Families,

This year we will be using a numbered "clip chart" to monitor our behavior and classroom choices. Your child will have a clip on a chart that he/she will physically move up or down, depending on his/her choices.

Please keep in mind that your child may not move every single day. Remaining on 4, "Ready to Learn" throughout the day represents a great day! In order to move up, students must go above and beyond expectations in their behavior choices. The chart below explains how the clip chart works.

OUTSTANDING!	Students who reach "Outstanding" (7) will be rewarded for
(7)	their excellent choices with a tally mark. Five tally marks earn
	a trip to the treasure box.
Great Job!	Students who reach "Great Job" (6) will be rewarded for their
(6)	excellent choices with a tally mark. Five tally marks earn a trip
, ,	to the treasure box.
Good Day!	As students begin making excellent choices, they will be
(5)	rewarded by moving their clip up to (5), which is one step
	closer to a "Great" or "Outstanding" day!
Ready to Learn	Everyone starts the day on "Ready to Learn!" (4) Students can
(4)	then move up, down, or stay on this level depending on their
	choices.
Think About It	Students who receive 1-2 warnings regarding their behavior will
(3)	move their clip to (3). A verbal warning/reminder is given
	before students are asked to move their clip as a way to help
	them focus on making good choices.
Teacher's Choice	Students who continue to make poor choices will move to (2).
(2)	This will result in a loss of privilege.
Parent Contact	Students who are continually making poor or dangerous choices
(1)	will move to (1). Parents will be contacted by phone call.

Lastly, students who move their clip above 7 will be recognized by "Off the Chart! (8) Their clip will be worn on my shirt or possibly sent to Administration to wear for the day. I believe that this system will be a positive way for students to monitor their choices and give them behavior goals to strive for! A daily number will be recorded in your child's planner to keep you informed. Having a 4 at the end of the day is a good day and your child has met our expectations!
