The academic subjects of Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies, and Science will receive a letter grade of:

Math

There will be math homework usually 4 nights a week. Please review these assignments with your child prior to turning them in the next day. Students should also practice their facts daily.

Spelling

Students will glue their spelling list into their agendas on the Monday prior to the spelling test. All spelling tests will be given on Fridays. Students should study their spelling words daily in any manner they choose.

Language Arts

Students are required to read as part of their homework assignment each night to meet their AR goals. Students must choose books within their reading levels and pass the tests with a minimum of 80% comprehension to earn AR prizes.

Science and Social Studies

Science and Social Studies are each taught for approximately ½ of each nine weeks with homework assigned as necessary. Students should review vocabulary words, study guides, and their class notes prior to taking the tests.
