COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to prepare students to take 7th-grade Math next school year. We will be expanding on foundational mathematical concepts over the course of 8 chapters.

TEXTBOOK/CURRICULUM

Students will have online access to their textbook by Pearson; this is where the majority of their homework assignments will be located. We will also complete assignments in the online programs iReady and ALEKS throughout the year to sharpen various math skills. Our textbook and iReady are accessible through Clever.

ASSESSMENT

Students' grades will be determined by using the following categories and percentages:

Practice	--	30%: HW, ALEKS assignments, iReady weekly goals
Performance (Mastery)	--	70%: Quizzes, Tests, iReady quarterly goals

Grading Scale: A (90-100) B (80-89) C (70-79) D (60-69) F (0-59)

PROCEDURES

Students are expected to bring all supplies (binder, pencils/erasers, etc.), completed work, and an AR book to class each day. They are **always** expected to keep their items under their desk or chair to keep the walkways clear.

We will be covering many interesting topics and going through a substantial amount of material over the school year. It's important to maximize class time, so students should use the restroom or visit the water fountain between classes. Classwork and supplies should be ready and waiting on students' desks when the tardy bell rings. If a student is worried about being tardy, they can come to class and check with me if they may use the restroom.

All pencil-and-paper assignments and notes should be completed in PENCIL. Name, date, and class period are required at the top of all such assignments. Assignments without a student's name are considered LATE and will receive a LATE grade if they are claimed later.

All assignments and notes are posted in Google Classroom. Homework is due at the start of the school day immediately following the day it was assigned unless otherwise specified. It is the student's responsibility to complete notes and missing assignments if they are absent. If they are absent for a test or quiz, they are responsible for coordinating a time with me before school to take it. **Please familiarize yourself with the VCMS policies on make-up work completion.** Work that is one day late will receive a maximum grade of 60%; work that is 2+ days late will receive a 0% (**please see the VCMS policy on late work**).

All of my students are responsible for themselves, their actions, their materials, and their learning. They are expected to adhere to all classroom policies and procedures. The Schoolwide Behavior Management Plan outlines the prescribed consequences for poor choices.
