1) Rules:

1. Follow instructions the first time they are given.
2. Keep hands, feet, and objects to yourself.
3. Cooperatively work with teacher and peers.
4. Be respectful and polite at all times.
5. Always do your personal best.

2) Consequences:

- First time a student breaks a rule: Student will receive a verbal warning.

- Second time: Student will "clip down" on behavior chart displayed in the classroom*.

- Third time: Student will "clip down" again on behavior chart displayed in the classroom*, will get 5 minutes sitting away from the group (Time out), and a behavior slip**.

*Homeroom teacher will be notified of individual students who were "clipped down" and will have those students clip down in their rooms as well.

**The behavior slip is to be attached to the student's planner, to be taken home, signed by parent, and returned to school. If a student collects two slips before the middle of the quarter, he/she will get an "N" for conduct at Progress Report time. Three or more slips during a quarter will warrant a "N" for conduct on student's Report Card.

- Fourth time: If the student's behavior continues to be disruptive, he/she will "clip down" a third time on behavior chart, and the teacher will request an administrator to remove the student from her classroom and a referral will be issued.

*Please note that if required because of gravity of infraction, the previous steps will be skipped and student will be removed immediately from the classroom by an administrator.

3) Rewards:

a. Individual and specific daily praise.

b. Stickers (to reinforce good behavior/attitude observed).

c. Teacher will reward classes with points. Depending on their behavior, classes will move up or down the "Clip Chart": students can earn up to 8 points (Top of the Chart), or as little as 1 point for unacceptable behavior (Parent Contact).

At the end of each nine-week period, the class/classes that collect/s the most

points in each grade level, will earn a certificate and students in that class/those classes will receive a reward.

Rewards will vary, some examples of them are: pencils, pens, bookmarks, etc. Also, time outside for games/book reading/special treat, etc. At the end of the school year, classes that obtained the highest number of points each and every quarter will enjoy a "¡Fiesta!" (End of the year party).
