Course Overview

This class serves to further the musical playing ability, listening skills, critical thinking skills, range of musical knowledge, and depth of musical knowledge in students as well as foster a curiosity for music as a whole. This course will cover expansive topics that relate to a multitude of other disciplines in order to draw connections to students' current interests and broaden their musical possibilities. The goal of the course is to educate students in a way that they can take their knowledge and passion for music beyond the classroom and into their outside lives.

Course Content

In Band I-IV we focus on the following:

- personal playing abilities
- personal practice skills
- ensemble playing & listening
- critique
- conducting
- music history
- music theory
- music and literacy
- the science of music

As well as other topics that students show an interest in throughout the year. The core topics have been chosen carefully to produce a well-rounded education that prepares the students to be successful in all aspects of being a musician.

Methodology

Band students will be instructed in a variety of methods, including, but not limited to:

- rehearsal
- class discussion
- conducting lab
- group work & group presentations
- individual work & individual presentations

Music Fair

All students are required to participate in our Music Fair during the spring semester. This will be a very exciting project for our students! They can elect to work alone or with a partner. Students choose a project that connects music to one of the following areas: Literature, Science, History, Culture, Food, Community Service, Fine Arts (dance, physical art), or Technology. Students will choose an idea they are interested in and get it approved by Ms. Warner. They will then work on the projects and present them to a panel of judges similar to a science fair.

Grading

- 10% Total
 - Bellringer (in class with music and instrument ready by teacher designated time)
 - Class participation (active role in all class activities, cooperation with teacher and peers, adherence to all class policies in the students contract)
 - In class assignments (graded for participation)

*A daily grade of 10 pts will be given which consists of the following: 5pts Bellringer
5pts Class Participation

- 90% Total
 - Rehearsal Attendance
 - Performance Attendance
 - Tests
 - Homework
 - In class assignments (graded for mastery)
 - Projects
 - All other work designated as an assignment by the teacher

Materials

- Music Folder (provided by school) Each student will be given a folder for the year to keep their music organized inside. ***MUSIC MUST BE IN CLASS EVERYDAY.*** Students missing their music and/or folder will receive a 0 as their participation grade for the day.
- Pencil- NO PENS! Students must have a pencil with them every day in class.
- Instrument (either student or school provided- ask Ms. Warner for details) All students are required to have their instruments (valve oil, reeds, mallets, mutes, etc. as well) in class every day and in working order. If a student does not have their instrument for the day or it is not in working order (forgot reeds, forgot mouthpiece, etc.) they will receive a 0 as their participation grade for the day.

Expectations

- participation in marching band & concert band
- attendance at all after school rehearsals and performances (for a grade)
- personal practice time outside of class
- music and instrument ready at beginning of class
- ask for help when needed
